In addition to the national parks, you will find many forestries, lakes and other nature reserves in the region that are very much worth a visit, such as Reestdal. On the border of Overijssel and Drenthe, the Reest winds its way through estates and flowery meadows. Grab your bike or put on your walking shoes. You will definitely see storks along the way.

Dwingelderveld

Another wonderful thing to do is to sail part of the great turf route. Combine this route, for example, with a visit to Meppel or Giethoorn or the beautiful Weerribben. Just a few of the many possibilities. Carry on browsing, get inspired and come experience nature yourself!

They each have their own story, characteristic scenery and unique atmosphere. Yet they are only a stone's throw away from each other: the National Parks Drents-Friese Wold, Dwingelderveld and Weerribben-Wieden. Explore the heathland, forests and water by foot, horseback riding, mountain bike or while paddling in a kayak or canoe.

Excursions and activities are organised in and around these parks throughout the year. The information centre will inform you about the current offer. This centre is the perfect starting point for a journey through nature.

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The Drenthe Heath Sheep graze on the left and the right. A young pine marten is getting climbing lessons from his parents. You can observe it all, while leaning your back against an old tree. Get on your knees – don't mind getting wet and dirty - and be amazed by an adder or an orchid hidden in the heathland. From the bird hide at the Davidsplassen you're able to see the rarest breeding birds of the Netherlands. And maybe you'll even hear the unique cry of an overflying crane.

Silence, vastness, heathland to the horizon, varied woods, drifting sands and dozens of beautiful lakes. Time seems to have stood still here. Step into another world in the Dwingelderveld, the largest silent wet heathland in Western Europe. No wonder you will find many rare plants and animals; it is a haven for butterflies and reptiles. If you're very quiet, you can see a grass snake or adder quickly get away or hear the unique cry of the crane.

The Visitor Centre at the Benderse in Ruinen is the ideal starting point for discovering the authentic landscape of Drenthe. There are many activities: from early bird tours to a walk with a pea soup lunch. During the summer you can see a shepherd bring sheep to the heathlands every morning at the sheepfold in Ruinen.

NATURE



The Beulakerwijde glistens in the sunlight. In the distance you can see - in the middle of the lake - something that looks like an iron structure. It is the top of a church tower with an iron bell, which recalls the story of the drowned village Beulake, a remarkable story. A dyke breakthrough became fatal for the village and its residents in the eighteenth century. Tie your boat or canoe to one of the metal posts and drift off with your thoughts. Suddenly something startles you: a grass snake winds through the waves alongside your boat.

The story of Beulake symbolizes the history of this National Park, which is - with its 10,000 hectares - the largest continuous peat bog in North-West Europe. You will immerse yourself in an oasis of calm. Ponds, lakes, ditches, mysterious-looking swamp forests, vast reed beds and small corners of hayfields; the buzzing dynamics of nature. It is a paradise for humans and animals, and a breeding ground for special plant and animal species.



The reed ensures varying landscapes throughout the year. If the reed is harvested in the winter, the views are endless. In the spring the fresh green stems slowly sprout out of the ground, and in the summer the waterfront is walled in with tall dark green reeds. Pure paradise: for otters, fire butterflies, dragonflies and for you as nature lover!

You feel the wind against your face. There, at the "Bare Dunes", a sand lizard shoots off. The mysterious Aekingerzand gives you the feeling you're in the desert. But the Drents-Friese Wold offers more than dusty sand and lizards. Raptors fly over. An adder warms up in the still watery spring sunshine. With a little luck you catch a flash of a fox, a polecat or a couple of deer.

You wander through the old, large pine forests. Suddenly the forest turns into heathland and before you know it you're strolling through meadows with unique plant species. You'll discover hidden fens here and there. At the Oude Groningerweg you will find the dolmen of Diever and colourful flowers in the stream valleys.

The area is vast: ideal to explore on horseback or by mountain bike. The rough trails are challenging and after some exercise the water of the Canadameer will be very refreshing. But also by regular bike or by foot, the Drents-Friese Wold is a wonderful experience. Magnificent in its beauty and variety, truly a Wold without borders.

The region challenges you to go outside. On a galloping horse or racing on a mountain bike. There are also a few climbing trails.

And those who really want to experience the sandy paths, wetlands and peat lands can take off their shoes. You actually feel the variations of nature when you're barefoot.

You can explore the Weerribben-Wieden and lakes around Giethoorn in a kayak. Or in a whisper boat, if you want to take it easy for a day. If there is ice, you can obviously use your ice skates.

DISCOVERY TOUR ON WATER

EQUESTRIAN SHOW


You'll ride through heathlands and dense, dark forests. Sometimes in step, at a trotting pace or gallop. Going full speed through mud puddles and winding paths gives a carefree feeling. From the saddle you can see raptors, deer and the most beautiful landscapes. Yes, as a rider you can truly indulge yourself in the region.

Also as a non-horse rider, you can make nice horse rides through the countryside. Step into a wagon or horse-drawn tram. This will be a trip to remember, for all ages. You can rent a wagon for one or more days.

The summer is one great horse festival in this region. At the driving competition in Zuidwolde you'll experience a grand spectacle at the Steenbergen water basin. During the 4-day horseback riding event in Dwingeloo you ride through woods, heathlands and meadows for four days.

SOMETHING FOR EVERYONE

Height differences, technical parts, sand, mud, and, not unimportant: good signage. In and around the three National Parks you will find challenging and varied mountain bike trails. There is something for everyone:

Appelscha (ca. 17 km)

A route through the woods: wider paths and winding single tracks alternate. Are you a trained mountain biker? Then a combination with the route in Diever is recommended. The connection route is indicated.

Diever- Hoogersmilde (ca. 23 km)

Long technical parts on single tracks. And although it is a flat area, you'll still encounter some steep climbs and descents. This makes this route a challenge.

Zuidwolde (West) (ca. 18 km)

This route near nature area Klein Zwitserland is extremely diverse with several single tracks through the woods, dirt roads and a few climbs at the end of the route. Hairpin turns, tree trunks, wooden bridge and jump bumps give you plenty to do!

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Ancient oaks, heathland and picturesque vistas. But also: cosy green villages with nice shops, terraces and good eateries.

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Villages such as Dwingeloo, Ruinen and Westerbork have an authentic atmosphere. It's like going back in time. But the region offers urban scenes as well: visit Steenwijk, Meppel and Hoogeveen to experience cities with a rich history.



You'll find museums and galleries, peculiar shops, cinemas and theatres, cafés and restaurants, cultural heritage and the largest fountain of the Netherlands.



LIVELY AND SPORTY

Taste locally brewed specialty beers while sitting by a fire in a pub and get ready to brave the winter cold to attend the special Northern Lights Parade.

It is one of the most spectacular events of Hoogeveen. But the city offers many more events: a number of sports events, such as the Ronde (round) of Drenthe and Cascaderun, a run for all ages. If you're a real daredevil you can make a parachute jump in Hoogeveen. Although you can also opt for a scenic flight over the beautiful region. Hoogeveen is characterised by the combination of nature, space and history. In the Hoofdstraat, these elements come together. Surrounded by shops, you'll find the largest fountain of the Netherlands: the Cascade. The Hoofdstraat also offers restaurants and a vibrant nightlife.

THE HOOGEVEEN Pancake

AT THE END OF 1600, PIECES OF PEAT LAND NEAR HOOGEVEEN WERE BURNED IN THE MONTHS OF MAY AND JUNE TO SOW BUCKWHEAT. BUCKWHEAT GRAINS - THAT LOOK LIKE BEECHNUTS - WERE GRINDED TO A KIND OF FLOUR THAT COULD NOT BE USED TO BAKE BREAD. BUT BAKING PANCAKES WAS POSSIBLE. THEY BECAME PART OF THE DAILY FOOD OF MANY SETTLERS, GIVING THEM THE NICKNAME 'PANCAKES'.



FACT

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MOSQUITOS OF MEPPEL

RESIDENTS OF MEPPEL ARE ALSO CALLED "MOSQUITOS OF MEPPEL OR MOSQUITO SPRAYERS". THEY OWE THESE NICKNAMES TO A FOLK TALE. ONE NIGHT SOME MEPPEL RESIDENTS SUPPOSEDLY THOUGHT THE CHURCH WAS ON FIRE, BECAUSE A CLOUD OF SMOKE HUNG OVER THE TOWER. IT TURNED OUT TO BE A SWARM OF FIREFLIES OR MOSQUITOES.

LIVELY AND UNIQUE

Meppel is lively and unique. The combination of nature, greenery, space and history makes Meppel attractive. Meppel is uniquely situated between three nature reserves.

The old city centre of Meppel with its characteristic streets, canals and squares with terraces is the setting for a pleasant shopping city. The people are hospitable and restaurants come in many shapes and flavours. Cafés, bars and a disco ensure a lively evening and nightlife.

Meppel is also a city of events. A visit to the Canal Festival or Thursday Meppel Days is a must. But you can also visit Meppel for arts, culture and monuments.

Wish to spend the night in Meppel or in the area? You can. Choose from B&Bs, campsites, a camper place, hotels and holiday homes. Or, sail to Meppel and dock your boat in the harbour or in the middle of the historic centre.

FORTIFIED CITY

A city full of extraordinary stories, hidden behind the stepped and bell gables at the Markt: the place downtown where the shopping areas come together.

After an afternoon stroll, the market square is the place to be. Enjoy a drink or a meal on one of the terraces.

You relive the past in Steenwijk. The 87-metre high Sint Clemens tower towers over the city and you will see one of the best-preserved examples of Art Nouveau: Rams Woerthe, a majestic Jugendstill villa. This cultural heritage is in the top 100 of Dutch monuments. You can still feel the buzz of the stories of battles and marching troops. They come to life during the summer Fortress Celebrations and the Dickens Christmas market.

A TRIP WITH THE KIDS

Strolling through the woods, building huts on the heathlands, crawling through a blackberry tunnel and getting lost in a corn maze. For kids, this region is paradise. A paradise where they have fun, but also playfully learn about animals and nature. For example, spending an afternoon at the play and ice cream farm Drentse Koe is absolutely worthwhile. Kids ride on a step tractor and milk a cow. For a moment, they are farmers. A visit to one of the sheepfolds is a must.

Crisscrossing the swamp forests with your canoe. Swinging on vines, on the road with the forester and - this is actually true tasting trees! Kids who love to play outside, love to explore and are not afraid of getting dirty, will be in for an adventure in the National Parks.

The so-called Boot Trails are a fun and adventurous way for them to explore nature. They balance on wooden platforms, jump over water and sink in soggy soil with their boots. The trails are surrounded by tall reed palms, shrubs and trees. The trail offers a surprise every few metres.

LITTLE PIGLET THEODOOR

"Longingly, between the planks of his cage, Theodore looks at the narrow wooden trail." This is how the story of little piglet Theodoor begins. When one day a girl comes along and opens his cage, Theodoor is free and sets off into the wide world.

If you are in Orvelte with kids, do not miss this. The story of Theodoor is not just a story about a piglet's adventure: in fact, the wooden trail is real and also passable in some places. In some places, the kids have to climb and scramble, like Theodoor. They hide in the tabernacle or in the foxhole and let Theodoor grunt, the birds whistle and the sheep bleat. Besides the wooden trail, there is a also trail for adults.

A dark night, a clear starry sky, deafening silence: go into the open field at night. Chances are you will see a shooting star. Due to the overwhelming darkness in this area, ASTRON, the Dutch Institute for Radio Astronomy, is situated on the edge of the Dwingelderveld.

If you're interested in the universe, follow the Melkwegpad – a scale model of the solar system - to the Westerbork telescope. Each step is in reality no less than 2.5 million kilometres.

To visit the Melkwegpad and Radio Observatory you can best park your car at the museum of camp Westerbork (address: Oosthalen 8 in Hooghalen). From here the route runs through the forest.

24 NIGHT WALK

DWINGELDERVELD

We hear rustling. It seems near. You sharpen your ears; is it a deer or maybe a badger? You're not allowed to visit preserved areas between sunrise and sunset, but in Dwingelderveld, the Dutch Society for Nature Conservation has plotted a special night walk.

You can hear the call of an owl when you walk around at night. Frogs give concerts and then, when the night ends and the day dawns, you can see the mist over the lake. Could this be the "witte wieven" (spirits of wise women)? Explore nightlife in nature; it is a unique experience. The starting point of this night walk is the car park of swimming pool De Paasbergen, Anserpad 2 in Dwingeloo. Bring a flashlight, which comes in handy, but try to use it as little as possible.

A SPECTACLE OF COLOURS

The sun sets. The sky turns orange, landscapes colour along. The moon comes out. The waterfront, where you just saw deer, fades as a silhouette in the dark.

The Dutch Society for Nature Conservation and the National Forest Service make it possible to enjoy this spectacle from the water in National Park Weerribben-Wieden. From May to October, they provide boat trips in the evening light and by the light of the full moon. The boats sail both on the Beulakerwijde and through narrow ditches. You can sign up for a boat trip at the visitor centre in Sint Jansklooster and the outdoor centre in Ossenzijl.

LIVING PAS

The impressive, monumental buildings in Frederiksoord and Willemsoord are very fascinating. And you can't stop photographing villages such as Ruinen, Orvelte and Dwingeloo. The Saxon farmhouses are picturesque, and this historic country estates and manors such as De Havixhorst, Huize Dickninge and Huize Voorwijk are true pearls in the landscape. The aristocratic history and richness of the past comes to life here. In Giethoorn you can stroll along the canals and cross the characteristic arched bridges. And in the vicinity of the Havelterberg and the Memorial Centre of camp Westerbork you can see and feel the tragic war history.

VAGRANTS COLONIES

In the area around Veenhuizen Willemsoord and Frederiksoord you go back to the early nineteenth century when General Johannes van den Bosch founded the vagrants colonies. In the Society of Charity, 'paupers' came here to work on the land. In return they received housing, education and care. This is how the general hoped to reduce poverty.

After a trial colony in Frederiksoord - with homes, schools, factories and churches - similar colonies in Willemsoord and Wilhelminaoord followed. A few years later, the idea of voluntariness was discontinued and coercion colonies were established in Veenhuizen and Ommerschans. You'll still find traces of the Colonies of Charity in these places. The cultural heritage is on the Provisional List of UNESCO World Heritage. Did you know that there is an app with a story trail about the colonies? This is how the olden days are portrayed in a modern way. You can also walk of number of Pauper trails via a route app.

ICONS OF DRENTHE

There are still three icons of Drenthe in this area, or: dolmens, the oldest monuments in Netherlands.

If you stand in front of them and look at these big and heavy boulders, you'll wonder how they could have built them in prehistoric times. People even thought the dolmens were built by giants. It remains a mystery. Two dolmens lie close together at the foot of the Havelterberg (address: Hunebeddenweg in Darp).

The third dolmen is located in Diever (address: Groningerstraatweg 3 in Diever).

This MTB route was constructed by the MTB club Havelte. Pay attention to the notes on the notice board and the website.

Start coordinates N52 47.062 E6 13.379 The route is near Havelte and leads you through the grounds of for instance Defence, the Society for Nature Conservation and the Forestry Commission. Havelte is surrounded by vast forests, heathlands, sand dunes and pastures. You can still see many remains from World War 2 in this area.

MTB ROUTE HAVELTE

The Green ATB route starts with a bike path, which soon turns into a grassy path. This path then challenges you with a mixture of sometimes narrow twisty single tracks where control skills are needed and sometimes wider paths where "clumsy people" will feel more at home. After a short cobbled road, you go back into the woods and experience some fun climbs and descents (do pay attention to the "wet circumstances diversion" that runs along the bike path). You'll end up at a junction where you have to choose between 19 and 27 km. For now, let's assume you take the 19 km route. Through broader wavy trails and two bridges you go back into the forest and cross a bike path. The surroundings change from forest to heathland and the route takes you along a fen. After a short bike path you come to the "Genius Well" where you can put your steering skills to the test. You then bike on towards the Hunebedden (dolmens) and via some asphalt you reach the last climb of this route, which ends at the butterfly garden.

STROLL ALONG SIGHTS IN THE HISTORIC CENTRE OF MEPPEL



CITY WALK WELCOME TO HOOGEVEEN

This city walk leads you through the friendly, well-organized centre of Hoogeveen. Hospitality and attention for each other are paramount: you are truly welcome in Hoogeveen! In many places along the route, the ANWB signs on the facades show additional information. This city walk starts at the entrance of the Tourist Info, the highlights of the route follow soon. You can go to the Tourist Info for a brochure that describes the entire route.

The volunteers also like to inform you about other routes, tourist information and authentic local products such as flour for the tastiest Hoogeveen pancakes ground by the mill De Zwaluw.

There are various historic buildings in the Hoofdstraat. These buildings have signs that explain the history of the property. Some properties were designed by city architect Jan Carmiggelt of early last century.

Along the way, you will also pass the beautiful Jugendstil building 22 of liquor store Dikkers, Grain Mill De Zwaluw and the Schippershuus: buildings that all tell part of the history of Hoogeveen.

In front of the Grote Kerk, you'll see a statue called Trommelslager (drummer), made by Johan Sterenberg. History tells us that a drummer would urge the peat labourers to attend church on Sunday.

You'll find several establishments on the way where you will be warmly welcomed and enjoy a cup of coffee or tea and sweets.

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DO YOU WISH TO KNOW MORE ABOUT THE HISTORY OF HOOGEVEEN? THEN VISIT, AMONG OTHERS, THE STORIES YARD IN THE PUBLIC LIBRARY AT THE WILLEMSKADE 27. HERE, YOU'LL FIND THE MUSEUM COLLECTION OF HISTORICAL HOOGEVEEN. AN ALTERNATING SETUP TELLS THE STORY OF HOOGEVEEN ON THE BASIS OF A NUMBER OF MASTERPIECES FROM THE MUSEUM'S COLLECTION. ENTRANCE IS FREE.
